### 4th. Biennial Brian Spitzberg JLSP Outstanding Reviewer

All that notwithstanding, the 4th. recipient of the now **Brian Spitzberg Outstanding Reviewer Award**—and a scholar that mirrored Brian's consistently wide-ranging skills and service—is **Megan Birney** (*University Centre, Shrewsbury, of the University of Chester, UK*).

### ***Inaugural Biennial Jake Harwood Outstanding Book Award (of 2020)***

In consultation with Jake, we felt recipients of this honor should fulfill one or more of the following criteria, that their volume should—(a) Be integral to the development of theory and/or methods in the social psychology of language; (b) Be relevant to the advancement of core areas of our sub-discipline; (c) Exude methodological eclecticism; (d) Be of international relevance; and (e) Draw on scholarship across disciplines. Our **1st Jake Harwood Outstanding 2020 Book Award** is very timely, not only in its satisfying *all 5* of our criteria, but in that it commemorates the work of two pioneers of the social psychology of language, namely, Wally Lambert and Bob Gardner. The book is:
